## NORTH VALLEY DISTRICT 2011 FIRST AID MEET

### Burn Scenario

**Scenario:** While making breakfast at Camp Eagle, a scout spills boiling water on his right forearm and screams. The Scout's right forearm is red and is beginning to blister (obviously a 2<sup>nd</sup> degree or partial thickness burn). The Scout is going into shock. Though the patrol has a cell phone available, there is no reception. The closest help is the Health Lodge Officer who is at the Health Lodge, approximately 7 minutes away. Only the patrol leader and the Scouts that go for help may speak to the judge.

ACTION TAKEN	POSSIBLE POINTS	POINTS EARNED
<b>SAFETY</b>	<b>5 Max pts</b>	
1. Scouts say they have medical gloves on or do have them on.	5	
<b>GOING FOR HELP</b>	<b>5 Max pts</b>	
1. Patrol sends two Scouts to get help <i><u>(if only 1 scout goes, then 2 points)</u></i>	5	
<b>GETTING HELP</b>	<b>15 Max pts</b>	
1. The Scout tells the Health Lodge Officer what happened		
a. A Scout has a 2 <sup>nd</sup> degree (partial thickness) burn on his right forearm from boiling water.	5	
2. The Scout explains what is being done to the victim	5	
3. The Scout escorts the Health Lodge Officer to the location.	5	
<b>BURN TREATMENT PROCEDURE</b>	<b>20 Max pts</b>	
1. The patient's burn is cooled with cold, running water until the pain is relieved.	10	
2. When the burn area is dry, apply loosely a sterile gauze pad and bandage. (A burn dressing may be used.)	10	
<i><b>If butter, creams, ointments, or sprays are applied subtract 5 points</b></i>		
<b>TREATMENT FOR SHOCK</b>	<b>10 Max pts</b>	
1. Keep the victim warm by covering with a blanket.	5	
2. Had the patient sit with his head between his knees or had him lay down and raised his legs about 12 inches.	5
