ACTION TAKEN	POSSIBLE POINTS	POINTS EARNED
VICTIM	5 Max pts	
A member of the patrol must demonstrate the International Sign of Choking. The judge may ask that a patrol member demonstrate.	5	
RESCUER	45 Max pts	
Rescuer asks if he can help. (Rescuer does not need to identify himself because of knowing each other.)	5	
Rescuer sends someone for help or has someone call.	5	
The Rescuer encourages the victim to cough. (Judge: Tell the victim they can not cough.)	5	
 The Rescuer stands behind the victim and places one foot between the victim's legs to have proper balance in case the victim becomes unconscious. 	5	
4. The Rescuer makes a flat area on the hand to go against the victim (a fist with the thumb inside or outside is ok, as long as the Rescuer creates a flat surface).	5	
5. The Rescuer places his hand (with the flat surface) in the area of the belly button with his other hand wrapped around the hand against the victim.	5	
6. The Rescuer administers 5 abdominal thrusts	5	
(Rescuer must only simulate, not actually perform it.)		
7. JUDGE: Ask how long you continue abdominal thrusts? RESCUER: Should state	10	
(a) until the object comes out and they start breathing	(3 pts each;	
(b) until they go unconscious (pass out)(c) until medical help arrives.	10 pts if all 3 correct)	
NOTE: Some organizations teach 5 abdominal thrusts and 5 back blows demonstrated, do not deduct or add points Back blows do not have to be demonstrated.
