## **CPR PROCEDURE**

Scenario: While at Eagle Lake, Cub Scouts are called for a buddy check. One Cub Scout can not find his 7 year old buddy. After a quick check by the Boy Scout lifeguards, the Cub Scout is found submerged in the shallow end of the lake. The Cub Scout is pulled from the lake unconscious and blue.

Though the patrol has a cell phone available, there is no reception. The closest phone is about three minutes away at the parking lot.

The Patrol Leader must give a detailed step by step procedure of what the patrol is doing. CPR is to be demonstrated but not actually performed.

Only the patrol leader and the Scouts that go for help may speak to the judge.
